

MEMBERSHIP GUIDE

Welcome to the Bay Cloverhill Community Association (BCCA)! We are glad to have you as part of this dedicated residents' association. The neighbourhood boundaries are east of Queen's Park Crescent West, south of Charles Street, west of Yonge Street and north of College Street.

Each full membership building should have a designated representative who attends bi-monthly general member meetings and can vote as required. The building representative should report on meeting content to their respective board and property manager. Keep the BCCA apprised of any changes to property management contact information. Meetings are typically held at 7 p.m. on the third Monday of January, March, May, July and September. Building with more than 100 units are entitled to have a secondary voting representative. An invoice for membership dues is issued annually.

The Annual General Meeting takes place at 7 pm on the third Monday of each November.
